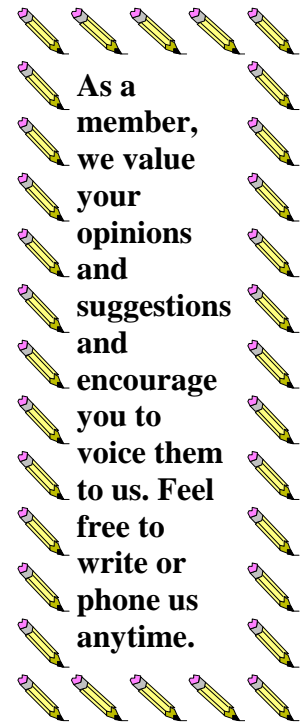

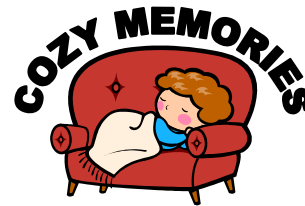

TICKED OFF BY TICKS?

As most of you probably have already noticed, ticks have been especially troublesome this year. The following is a procedure forwarded to Caring Hands by a newsletter reader, Lea Schwart of Marion:

A School Nurse wrote the original information, which is good enough to share and really works! I had a pediatrician tell me what she believes is the best way to remove a tick. This is great, because it works in those places where it's sometimes difficult to reach with tweezers: between toes, in the middle of a head full of dark hair, etc.

Apply a glob of liquid soap to a cotton ball. Cover the tick with the soap-soaked cotton ball and let it stay on the repulsive insect for a few seconds (15-20), after which the tick will come out on its own and be stuck to the cotton ball when you lift it away.

This technique has worked every time I've used it (and that was frequently), and it's much less traumatic for the patient and easier for me. Unless someone is allergic to soap, I can't see that this would be damaging in any way. I even had my doctor's wife call me for advice because she had one stuck to her back and couldn't reach it with tweezers. She used this method and immediately called me back to say, "It worked!"

Please pass on this helpful hint!

The price includes the cost of a physical examination, spaying or neutering, deworming, micro-chipping, feline leukemia testing, and appropriate vaccinations given by our staff veterinarian. However, if two new felines is just too much for you or your family, adopting one kitten or cat is \$40, a marked decrease from the normal fee. This price includes the same veterinarian services mentioned above.
